



FAT QUARTER POP-UP

Skill Level: Confident Beginner ~ Makes Small Size Only ~ See safety instructions on page 2.

Materials	Small Finished Size: 6" H x 5-1/2" D
Fabric	Non-Directional - Fat Quarter (1) OR Directional - 3/8 yd
Midweight Stabilizer SF101 Shapeflex Interfacing by Pellon	3/8 yd
Contents What's in the bag...	Small Pop-Up Spring (1) Sew Organized Design Label (1) Elastic (1) Instructions for Small Size Only Pattern for Base Circle



Collapses for easy storage!

Notions: 4 Large Safety Pins - **required**, Small Scissors, Marking Pencil

DO NOT REMOVE TAPE FROM SPRING until instructed in the pattern!

This pattern is **One Size Only**.
Not recommended for children under the age of 12.

Compatible Refill: FQG121 Small 5.5" Pop-Up Refill

For other sizes, use FQG122 Stacking Pop-Ups pattern which makes all 5 sizes.
Construction method is different and springs are sold separately from pattern.

Dimensions to make larger sizes using this pattern:

The base circle patterns are supplied with the springs, so I won't list them here.

Size	Body Side Rectangle	Elastic Length & Suggested Width
Medium	16.5" H x 26.5" W	12" long - 1/2" wide
Large	22.5" H x 34.5" W	14" long - 3/4" wide
XL	32.5" H x 45.5" W	16" long - 1" wide

For the larger sizes, you **do not** need to pull gathering stitches on the bases after stitching them wrong-sides together. Only the FQ (small) size needs it gathered. This was a result of working within the restrictions of a FQ.

Help! My spring absolutely won't fit between the layers!

Double check the folded dimensions at the top of page 4.

If the fold was accidentally done the wrong way the resulting size will be way too small.

Help! My spring is twisted inside the pop up when I released the safety pins!

This can happen. I have a handy video showing the technique to get it untwisted. You can find it on my [YouTube channel](#). To help you prevent this from happening on future pop ups, be careful to roll the fabric over the spring when you are turning the pop up to the right side in the final steps. It also helps to leave a little more room between the bottom seam and the safety pins. This makes it easier to roll the fabric without the spring getting in the way.
